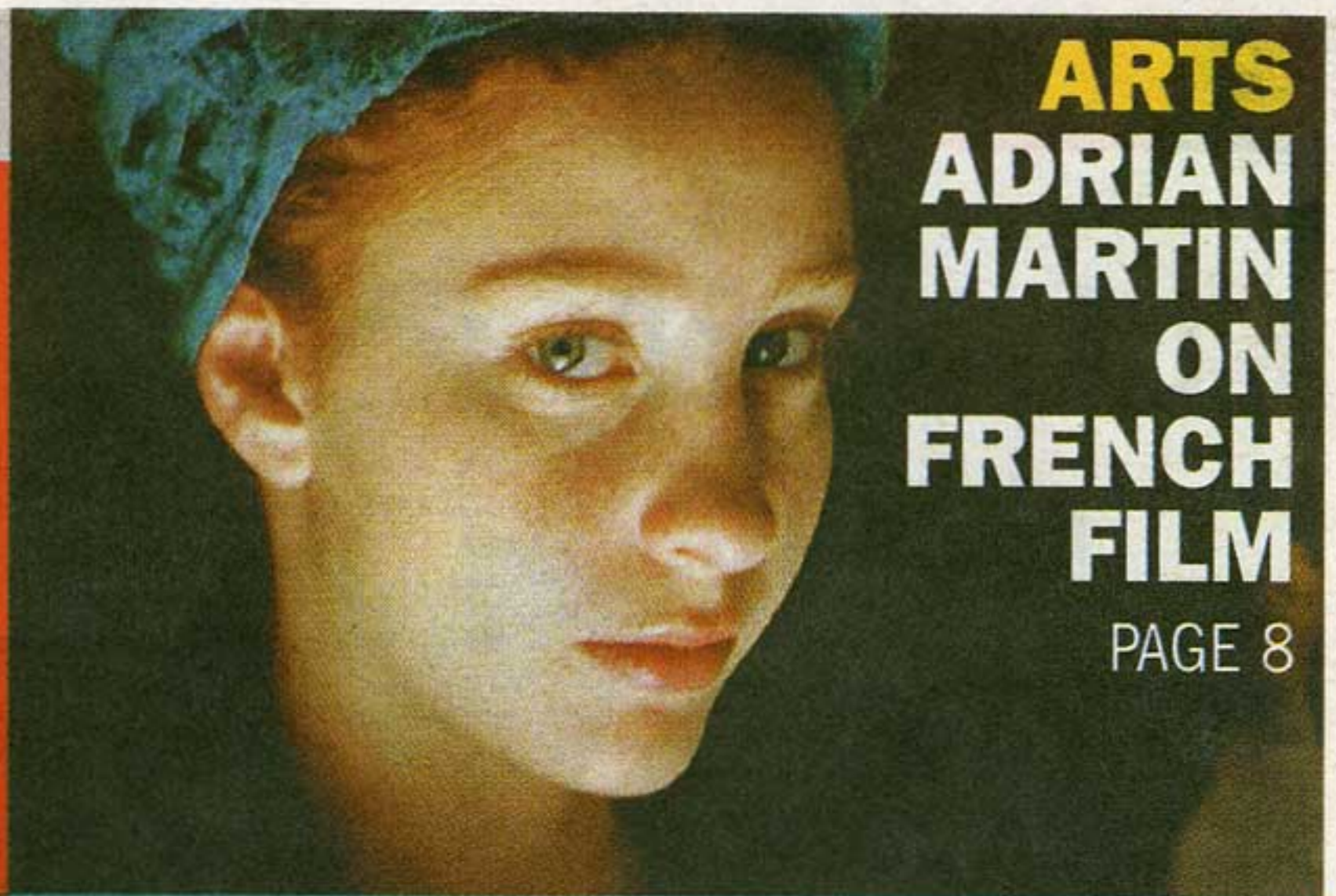

IN A WET February, it's worth noting that artist Fred Williams believed in using water distribution patterns as the focus of his work. He was particularly interested in the Yarra, exploring and painting it from its upper reaches to its mouth. This exhibition in Langwarrin, including *Dry Creek Bed*, *Werribee Gorge 1* (above), explores water as a focus and a life force in an arid land. And while you're at the gallery, you can explore the sculpture park in the grounds – that is, if it's not raining.
